# All students study a core of GCSE courses:

- English
- English Literature
- Mathematics
- Sciences (double or triple)
- Religious Studies
- Either Geography or History

# THE CORE KEY STAGE 4 CURRICULUM

In addition all students will follow nonexamined courses in:

- Physical Education
- Personal, Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education (including preparation for working life)



# THE ENGLISH BACCALAUREATE

### GCSE grades at 4 or above in five disciplines:

- English
- Mathematics
- Sciences
- History or Geography (can opt for both)
- a Language (may opt for more than one language)

The majority of students in the school will achieve the English Baccalaureate – giving a broad range of academic qualifications.

All students will take at least 8 GCSEs. Some will take 11 GCSEs

## THE OPTIONAL CURRICULUM

The remainder of the courses studied are chosen by the students.

#### These need to be chosen with care so that:

- They reflect the aptitudes & interests of the student
- They support the career aspirations of the student
- They match the student's ability and therefore offer a high chance of success



### **CURRICULUM PATHWAYS**

To assist students and families when making options choices, students will be directed towards one of three curriculum pathways. Each of these pathways offers a different mix of courses.

There are three pathways: green, blue & yellow.

Within the yellow pathway students focus on achieving technical and vocational courses along with a range of academic subjects.

Within the green pathway <u>all</u> students will be <u>expected</u> to take English Baccalaureate subjects with additional option choices.

Within the blue pathway <u>all</u> students are <u>recommended</u> to take English Baccalaureate subjects with additional academic and vocational option choices.

THE PATHWAYS ARE NOT STREAMS – CLASSES WILL CONTAIN A MIX OF STUDENTS ON DIFFERENT PATHWAYS THROUGH KEY STAGE 4



## **CURRICULUM PATHWAYS**

#### Guidance re- pathways will be based upon:

- Students current attainment in different subjects
- Prior attainment (in Key stage 2)
- Specific skills (e.g. in languages)
- Interests and ambitions of the child
- Literacy and Numeracy levels
- Staff professional knowledge and understanding
