

want to, they can borrow them and take them home.


The feedback from the students has been positive, and out of fourteen feedback forms received seven said that the breakfast club is brilliant, five said it was very good and two said it was good.

## Green Energy Technology Club - GET!

The Green Energy Technology Club (GET) is set up as a joint Science and Technology department project. The focus is to encourage students to become involved in a 'real world' project based on Green Energy. The challenge is for students to



identify a problem and work in groups to provide possible solutions.

A number of Year 8 and Year 9 students were invited to attend the introductory session which outlined the tasks ahead. The plan is for students to enter their projects into the TeenTech 2018 awards. This is a national Science and Technology competition. We had success last year and gained a Silver Award. This year we are going for Gold!

The second session involved two experts in the field of Green Energy. Tony Cowling and John Booth. They gave up their time to discuss a wide range of topics promoting thinking about the environment and how the future of the planet is reliant on solutions in the way we use and generate energy. The students gained an insight into the local hydroelectric plant at Caversham Weir, electric cars, solar energy and there was a wide ranging discussion with some





great questions from students. This session really helped students focus their thoughts.

The sessions run weekly and already there are some great ideas and projects emerging that hopefully will provide solutions to more efficient use of energy which should benefit us all. The GET students have been very enthusiastic and are already planning the next stages of their projects.






Macbeth
