## Dear Parent/Guardian

I am sure that you were shocked to hear about the tragic events in Forbury Gardens which led to the death of three people. Whilst our minds have been on the threat and difficulties around COVID, online learning and increasing our re-opening, this news of the reality of violence in a park less than a mile away from our school is utterly heart breaking. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of all those affected; we wish the injured a speedy recovery and the bereaved every comfort.

At 10am, year 10 and special provision students in school paused for a minute of silence. In doing this, we joined with the whole Reading community. Whilst the attack physically harmed a few, we all share a sense that this has been an attack on the whole community of which we are so proud. These are the words we used with students this morning:

"We must come together and be determined that events like this will not make us afraid or fearful of one another. We will not give in to hatred. Instead we will <u>choose</u> to be tolerant, to accept and to love."

Whilst we have all been shocked and distressed, most of us will be able to manage our feelings of grief and shock. We are aware however that some students and families may be particularly affected and need some additional support and help. If you or your child falls into this category please do seek out support
