Dear Parents and Carers,

September expectations and arrangements

You will have recently received a letter from Mrs Walker, Director of Inclusion and Safeguarding for Maiden Erlegh Trust, and I wish to reiterate the importance of this letter.

From the start of term in September, the usual rules on school attendance will apply, namely that parents have a duty to ensure that their child attends school regularly and schools have a duty to follow up absences which includes the issuing of sanctions, including fixed penalty notices.

Where a pupil/student is unable to attend school because they are complying with clinical and/or public health advice, we will offer them access to remote education and their absence will not be penalised. We expect there to be very few children in this category, however. All other pupils must attend school unless a statutory reason applies (for example, the pupil has been granted a leave of absence, is unable to attend because of sickness, is absent for a necessary religious observance etc).

I would also like to draw your attention to the expectations around uniform. This is compulsory, and should you have difficulties with purchasing uniform and are entitled to receive support from the Pupil Premium grant, please refer to my recent Pupil Premium letter <a href="Pupil Premium Pupil Premium Pupil

The requirement for uniform can be found on the website <u>here</u>. Please note that school shoes should be black leather shoes, not black trainers. An example can be seen below:
