I am writing to share invaluable information regarding our Trust careers software platform and how you can use it to best support your child at home to navigate the world of work, explore and develop employability skills and to help young people to prepare for their next steps.

U-Explore is an EdTech company specialising in careers guidance for young people in schools. It is a free and comprehensive digital platform which provides students with the ability to take control of their future destinations through up-to-date and detailed careers guidance. Due to current restrictions we have decided to provide this information virtually this year.

This software package is a fantastic opportunity to explore the many different options available to young people, including:

- Up-to-date information from a variety of trusted sources.
- Careers guidance for students in Years 7 to 13.
- Support and guidance through key moments of choice and transition from education to employment.
- Comprehensive information on careers and employability skills.
- Local labour market information.
- Support with writing job applications and CVs, visiting assessment centres and the recruitment process.

Students will need to set up their own personalised profiles, including interests, work preferences and skills. The software will then provide specific job ideas including information on entry routes, information about different careers and earning potentials. This will enable students to make decisions about jobs and professions that suit their individual personality and skills. Students will also be able to think through areas they may need to improve upon, the courses and subjects that they may need to take, support with decisions regarding college, university and apprenticeship routes and finding out who is recruiting locally in their professions of interest.

During tutor sessions your child has already been provided, or is in the process of being provided, with information about how to log in to the software and set up their profile.
