Dear Parent/Guardian

Notification of positive COVID-19 lateral flow test result – Year 11

I am writing to inform you that a student in Year 11 has tested positive on a lateral flow device. On receiving the notification, we contacted The Department for Education to discuss the situation and to clarify the action we need to take. We have identified 27 Year 11 students as close contacts of the affected student and these students will be sent home today to isolate, at this stage for 10 days. Parents of the students identified as close contacts have already been contacted this morning. The affected student is taking a confirmatory PCR test and if the result of this is negative, students and staff identified as close contacts will be able to end their isolation period and return to school. We will of course share this result as soon as it is known.

We do appreciate that this will cause some disruption to year 11 PPE's and we will be in touch as soon as possible with alternative arrangements.

Once again, it is critical that should your child or anyone in the household display symptoms, the guidance below is followed. **Please can I also remind all parents/ guardians that students should not attend school if anybody in the household is symptomatic or is awaiting test results.**

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/askfor-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 10-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 10 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community.

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough;
- a high temperature;
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19.

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds;
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available;
- wash your hands as soon as you get home;
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze;
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards.
