Covid-19 home Testing kits

We have been advised by the DfE that the Covid home testing scheme will continue, subject to review at the end of September 2021. Covid home testing kits will be handed to your child after their second test in school today. **Please note that the home test kits require a throat and nasal swab, whereas the in-school tests this month have required a double nasal swab.**

Please note that by receiving and opening the test at home, you are legally committing to reporting your child's results via [the NHS Test & Trace reporting system](#). All test results must also be reported to the school, whether negative or positive. Please follow the link here to report the result to your child's school:


Please note the following:

- Students aged 11 should be assisted with the test, all other students should be supervised;
- The current guidance is to not eat or drink anything for 30 minutes before undertaking the test;
- It is advised that anybody who has tested positive for Covid-19 in the past 90 days does not take a test;
- The suggested schedule is to test on a Sunday evening/ Monday morning and Wednesday evening/ Thursday morning and to know the result before coming to school;
- A positive result on a home test will need to be confirmed by a PCR test which can be booked [here](#). The child will need to isolate until the result is known;
- The home test kits provided are for the sole use of the student. Test kits for the rest of the family can be obtained from your local test centre;
- You should seek medical assistance via 111 or 999 if urgent medical assistance is required during the testing process.

If you would like your child to test themselves at home but have not previously provided consent for them to be tested in school, please ask your child to speak to their tutor to arrange for tests to be provided.

Please contact me via the office if you have any questions or if you wish to discuss anything further. I would strongly encourage you to assist your child to undertake the tests routinely and in accordance with the instructions provided to help keep our school free of any Covid-19 cases or outbreaks.
