Criteria for invitation

At the end of Foundation (Years 7 and 8) any students who have secured 5L in English, Mathematics and Science or who are predicted 8L or above in all their courses, are invited to join the Gold Programme. Pupil Premium students may have one 7H prediction outside the core subjects and may have scored a 4H in one of English, Mathematics and Science.

Any student who shows exceptional performance during Key Stage 4 may be invited on to the Gold programme.

- What you can do?
 - Provide a quiet working space if possible
 - Listen when they feel anxious
 - Check ClassCharts
 regularly
 - Encourage them to prepare early and to not give up
 - Help with creating revision timetables
 - Help to make effective use of time
 - Communicate with us

BELIEVE IN THEM

- What they can do?
 - Prepare early! This helps to ease anxiety too!
 - Ask their teachers for support if needed.
 - Utilise the exam tips they have been given is PSMSC.
 - Use PLCs and any Schemes of Work that subjects have provided them.
 - Make use of any online platforms for revision, e.g. Google Classroom, Hegarty Maths, DrFrostMaths, Kerboodle
 - Complete past papers for subjects
 - Use the work in class as their key revision tool.
 - <u>Remain focused throughout the</u> <u>year! Not just before the exams!</u>

BELIEVE IN THEMSELVES

• What we can do?

- Students were informed of when PPEs will be in first assembly of they year.
- PSMSC for this half term has been on exam preparation.
- I will also remind students of these dates on return from half term in February. A letter will also be sent home
- Tutor time will be allocated to exam tips in the week 22/2.
- The week prior to the PPE exams (w/c 8/3) will be a revision week for students to revise in tutor time

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What do the grades mean?

9-1 Assessment and GCSE grading


Replaces the old A*- G system for GCSE grades

- 9 is high, 1 is low (a rough comparison guide is below)
- Grade 5 is considered a strong pass, 4 a good pass
- New exam courses on all subjects

GCSE A*-G/1-9 Equivalent

New GCSE Grades	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9

Route 1

They did not get 9-4 grades

Their next steps

They could go to Sixth Form or College but will have to sit Level 2 courses which includes English and Maths

They could do a level 2 apprenticeship but will have to also sit Maths and English



Route 2

They got 5 of grades at 9-4 BUT not both English and Maths

Next steps

Could go to Sixth Form or College but MIGHT have to sit Level 2 course which includes English and/or Maths

Could go to Sixth Form or College and MIGHT be able to take Level 3 course **BUT** have to take **English and/or Maths**

Could do a level 2 apprenticeship but will have to also sit Maths and/or English



Route 3

They got five grades at 9-4 They also got English and Maths at Grade 4 or above

Next Steps

Could go to Sixth Form or College and will be able to chose which A-levels they would like to take.

They could do a level 2 or Level 3 apprenticeship

- 1 day of site visits or a pre-arranged placement organised by the student





Uniform


I want every student in my year group to look as smart as possible. Please support me with maintaining that high standard.

- School shoes not trainers
- A single pair of <u>plain</u> studs
- Smart and tidy hair in a natural colour
- Plain face mask, ideally in navy or black, worn any time they are not in a classroom
- Coats and jackets should not be worn in the school building,

On days when students have PE they have to come in with PE kit on. This should be:

- School navy PE top, either short or long sleeved
- Navy shorts or tracksuit bottoms with no logo or design. Not leggings
