Cognitive Abilities Test

In October I sent you a letter indicating that we would be administering the Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT4) to all students in year 7. This process is now complete, and I am pleased to share with you a report generated for your child. The report has been handed out today during your child's tutor period.

This report is self-explanatory and should be read alongside the progress report you will receive via the Parent App on Monday 7 February. The CAT4 report explains what CAT4 is and why schools use them. It then gives you some helpful insight into the type of questions that your child answered during the tests. It is followed by a summary of your child's profile and some characteristics or traits you may already recognise in their learning style.

In addition, CAT4 scores give an indication of likely GCSE grades for your child. This uses a very similar approach to the Fischer Family Trust (FFT) estimates process. Over the last two weeks your child has considered their subject estimates from FFT to help them set aspirational student own targets. You will be able to see these student own targets on your child's report this coming Monday. You may notice that the indicators for GCSE grades in the CAT4 report are slightly lower than our adopted system derived from FFT. Our benchmarks for student progress are highly aspirational and we aim for all students to achieve their best.
