End of summer term 2022

Time has flown by, and we have reached the end of another school year.

I am so proud of our school community and what has been achieved since September. Last day of term

Thursday 21 July is our last day of term. Students will spend the morning in a mix of lessons and time with their tutor, before we have our final whole school assembly. This will provide the opportunity for awarding whole school prizes and celebrating the successes of the year. Students will then return to their tutor rooms and will be dismissed from school at around 12.10pm.

New school year

The new school term begins with two staff training and preparation days (1-2 September). School opens to students on Monday 5 September. To enable us to support the new year 7 students, we will have a staggered start to the day:

- Year 7: students to be in school to begin at 8.40am
- Year 8-11: students to be in school to begin at 10.15am

The first day of term will begin with a focus on restart messages, orientation, and administration (e.g., distribution of new timetables) with formal lessons commencing from period 4. Please remember that the school day has a consistent start and finish time of **8.40am** – **3.10pm**.

Summer is also a good time to ensure that students have their tools and equipment for learning.
