
Tutor Reading Programme


Our Tutor Reading Programme for Years 7-11 aims to promote the enjoyment of reading as well as having proven results in increasing students' reading age.


Year 7



Artemis Fowl is a teenage master criminal trying to restore his family fortune by extorting gold from the fairies.





Year 8




Refugee Boy by Benjamin Zephaniah links with our core values of determination and respect as we follow young refugee, Alem, as he tries to find a place in British society.






Year 9




Sam is only fifteen but he and his autistic older brother, Avery, have been abandoned by every relative he's ever known. Now Sam's trying to build a new life for them.







One of Us Is Lying is the story of what happens when five strangers walk into detention and only four walk out alive. Everyone is a suspect, and everyone has something to hide.



Year 10




In this world, girls are outcasts by blood and warriors by choice.

She is an Alaki, a near-immortal with exceptional gifts. A stranger offers her a choice: fight for the emperor, with others just like her, or be destroyed...




