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#### FROM THE HEADTEACHER

# Year 10 students explore careers and apprenticeships in healthcare


14 Year 10 students gained great insight into apprenticeships in healthcare when they attended a live webinar on Thursday 20th April 2023. The 1 hour session included an overview of degree apprenticeships in Nursing and Physiotherapy. Our students were also introduced to the brand new Medical degree apprenticeship - due to be launched in January 2024. We learned that there are apprenticeships at a variety of levels offered in both healthcare and many other roles (including administration and other support roles - there are even apprenticeships for Electrical Installation!). Students reported finding out about these jobs; how apprenticeships work, and top tips for searching and applying for them, to be extremely helpful. They also learned that apprenticeships are advertised to external AND internal applicants (internal


applicants are people who already work in the NHS/particular hospital).

After the session, we discovered there are students interested in training and working as nurses, doctors, and physiotherapists in the future. There are over 350 jobs in the NHS, a number of which have related apprenticeships. It's never to early to start searching! Ever since his sister Evie died in an accident, Bren's only safe space is Furthermoor, an imagined world of mechanised trees and clockwork animals, where Evie is still alive.

"The story is part fantasy, part real -life and it was the real world that got me hooked. I can defiantly recommend it."



Ash lives in the coldest part of the monster infested snow sea where he waits for his missing parents. However, whilst in a dangerous situation he finds he is a song weaver. Rejected by the tribe, he boards the ship, 'Frost Heart', to look for his parents.

"I recommend this book to 10–12year-olds as it is full of comedy and has an unpredictable plot twist. The illustrations also brought it to life."

### So You Want to be a Doctor Club



On Friday 12th May, the 'So you want to be a doctor' club had a visit from the University of Reading's Health Reach Team to talk about the different ways in which we can measure health. These included monitoring pulses and respiratory rates, and using equipment to give other useful data. Students were able to try out using:

- pulse oximeters,
- blood pressure monitors,
- stethoscopes,
- grip strength dynamometers,
- thermometers,
- a vertical jump tester,

- · a doppler test,
- and peak flow meters.

Students really enjoyed this hands on activity! Many thanks to the University for making this possible.

We have two more workshops coming up, led by the same team: 'Outbreak' on Friday 19th May and First aid on Friday 9th June. Year 7-9 students can express an interest by commenting on the notice that will be put on each year group's Google classroom to request a space. *Mrs Rogeon*

On May 16th 2023, we finally said farewell to our year 11 students after 5 years.


As a school community, we feel that it is important to say Goodbye and Good luck to all year 11'students.

# Duke of Edinburgh Award practice expeditions

This half term 31 year 9s and 38 year 10s went on separate overnight camping weekends to help them gain valuable practical experience ready for their Bronze and Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award expeditions in the final term. The students spent time in after school training sessions planning in groups a walking route using OS maps before going on their respective practice weekend to follow the route in real life whilst carrying all of the equipment required (including the tents!). This made for some rather heavy backpacks but the determination of the

students and a bit of team work saw them successfully reach their destinations without staff intervention despite some navigational errors. The students also practiced cooking their own substantial meal before putting up

their tents and sleeping overnight. The year 9 Bronze DofE pupils stayed at John Madejski Academy whilst the year 10 Silver DofE students stayed at Rushall Farm. After walking
