Dear Parent/Guardian

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome your child to their final academic year at Maiden Erlegh School in Reading. It goes without saying that the year ahead is the most important year to date, and with this in mind it is imperative that students return rested and prepared.

Attendance and Punctuality

Particularly in Year 11, we ask that students take full responsibility for their punctual arrival to Tutor, and thereby punctual arrival to school. With their GCSE examinations set to start at 9am and preparatory sessions beginning from 8am, we urge students to start the academic year as they mean to go on. Lateness to Tutor, is lateness to school.

It is imperative that students are **in Tutor daily by 8.40am**. Students need to be on site by 8.35am at the latest, with those needing to go to their lockers expected to arrive earlier, allowing ample time to organise themselves. It is the student's responsibility to ensure they are present and punctual, to ensure they hear key communication – pastoral and curricular.

Should your child be unwell, **absences must be reported by 8.30am** to ensure they are coded correctly. These should be reported to Attendance, and not to your child's Form Tutor as outlined in the school's policy.

Uniform

High expectations of uniform are of extreme importance. Pride in uniform reflects pride in one's self. All students are expected to wear full school uniform on return in September.

- All students must own and wear a blazer at all times, in school, unless they are told otherwise; this is compulsory uniform. The school's sweater is optional.
- Students should wear black, polishable school shoes. Boots, trainers, canvas shoes etc. are not appropriate and students should not wear them. Shoes should be sensible i.e. not have thick soles or high heels/wedges.
- Trouser/skirt colour should be grey/charcoal
- Students can wear coats to and from school but not inside the building. Outdoor jackets do not include hooded sweatshirts.
- One small silver/gold stud in nose and one in each ear only; no other jewellery should be worn to school.
- No make-up is allowed, except light foundation.
- Nails should be of natural length and nail varnish is not permitted.
- Hair should be of a natural colour.

Equipment

In order to avoid disruption to learning and so that all students are able to promptly engage with lessons on arrival, please ensure that your child brings their own equipment to school daily.

Students should arrive daily with a sensibly sized school bag, complete with any exercise and/or text books for the day. The minimum expectation with regards to compulsory, standard equipment is as follows:

- Pens
- Pencils
- Eraser
- Ruler
- Green pen
- Sharpener
- Pencil case
- Specialised equipment (Scientific calculator, etc.)

Pencil cases can be purchased from Student Services for £2. Each holds the necessary equipment. We advise that if you are unable to supply your child with the list of stationary above, that they purchase this provision on their return.
