Welcome back to the new academic year 2023-2024; we hope you had a lovely break and are now starting to think about returning to school.

Please take some time to read through this letter as it goes through important information you will need to know.

The new school term begins on Tuesday 5 September 2023 for Year 7 and Wednesday 6 September 2023 for Years 8-11. The first day of term will begin with a focus on restart messages, orientation, and administration (e.g., distribution of new timetables) with formal lessons commencing from period 3.

Tuesday 5 September 2023, Year 7 will go straight into the Sports Hall for an assembly with Mr Carpenter, Head of Year 7.

Wednesday 6 September 2023, Year 8 will go straight into the Sports Hall on arrival for an assembly with Miss Ryan, Head of Year 8. Years 7,9,10,11 will go to their **new** tutor rooms, please see rooms below.

As we start the school year, we would like to remind you of the importance of good attendance for all students. Every day a student is absent is a lost opportunity for learning. Too many absences not only can affect achievement for the absent student but also can disrupt learning for the entire class.

The first week back is key for many reasons; you learn all about the year coming up; you meet all your new teachers, and you settle into the routines and expectations of school. Research also shows that attendance in the first week has a clear link to students' attendance across the year. Those who had poor attendance in the first week went on to have poor attendance across the year and thus this significantly impacts students' achievement and wellbeing.
