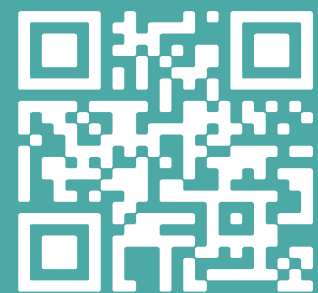

What You Need To Know

RoutetoRecruit is a partnership between Ways into Work and Activate Learning, Brookfields and Addington SEN Schools. We build relationships with employers to set up supported internships work placements for young people with SEN and an EHCP to learn the on-the-job practical skills they need to secure paid employment.

What is a Supported Internship?

This is a study programme where you mainly learn in the workplace, having on the job training while going to college for just one day a week to learn related work and life skills and sometimes English and Maths.

What will I gain from it?

- ✓ Learn new skills that employers are looking for
- ✓ Improve your independence and confidence
- ✓ Try different job roles with the help of an experienced Job Coach
- ✓ Around two thirds of those completing the course get into employment

How does it work?

- The internship runs in line with the academic year, from September to July
- You will be enrolled at a college/school and attend college 1 day a week
- 3 or 4 days of the week you will be in a work placement, learning on the job with support

Other Key Questions:

Will I be paid?

No - you will be regarded as being in education so there is no pay.
The aim is to upskill you and improve your chances of getting paid work at the end of the Internship.

Who can apply?

You, if you have special educational needs and an open Education Health & Care Plan (EHCP), are 16-24 years old (min. 18 for hospital placements) and are motivated to work.

Where are the internships based?

We have a variety of placements across Berkshire available including NHS hospitals, SEN schools, companies in IT, Retail, Hospitality, Facilities Management, Care and more ...

How do I apply?

Attend our Information Session usually held in January/February each year. From February you can then apply for the following start in September, using an online link we provide. Make sure you talk about this to your School/College in your Annual Review.
